This letter comes in support of Adaptive Homes CDC and the wonderful work they are doing providing permanent homes to our military families. I have been working with Adaptive Homes CDC for the past year and find them to be responsive and committed to assuring that Veterans are able to find permanent housing.

In the past year, I have placed two Veterans in these homes. This has allowed one Veteran to have a home of his own that he has never had before. This Vet was pending homelessness and was placed in Adaptive Homes CDC without concern for his ability to pay. His current income was approximately \$117.00 a month until he is approved for service connected disability. That process can be daunting and take up to two years to complete. However, this was of no concern to Adaptive Homes CDC, whose only mission was to assure that the Veteran receive a home of his own. This Veteran now believes in miracles because of this opportunity.

My other Veteran has been working towards financial independence and earns approximately \$500.00 a month. She too, was placed in Adaptive Homes CDC and considers herself blessed to have had this opportunity.

We have several other pending placements and I am inspired and pleased to have the opportunity to work with Adaptive Homes CDC.
